



HAZARDOUS MATERIAL COMPLIANCE STATEMENT

The United States Department of Transportation (DOT), Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration, govern the transportation of hazardous materials by highway, rail, vessel, and air. They prohibit the movement of articles or substances by air that poses a significant risk to health, safety, and/or property, without proper packaging, labeling, and documentation. Any person who knowingly violates a requirement of the Federal Hazardous Material Transportation Law is liable for a civil penalty for each violation.

All cargo / humanitarian goods tendered to The Boeing Company for carriage on a Humanitarian Delivery Flight are subject to inspection and/or rejection at point of loading.

Material Safety Data Sheets must be provided immediately when requested by The Boeing Company for any item in the shipment.

Due diligence should be taken as Humanitarian aid may contain hidden dangerous goods such as batteries in electric wheel chairs and Lap Top Computers, flammable liquids in Medical supplies or compressed gases in consumer products.
